# AROUND THE ACADEMY

## ROOTED IN FAITH

At St. Mary's Academy, we anchor ourselves in our Catholic faith, recognizing that a strong spiritual foundation helps us navigate life with kindness, grace, curiosity, resilience, and a desire to grow, serve others, and contribute meaningfully to the world. Each year, we are guided by a school theme that invites both reflection and action. The theme for 2024–2025 was “How do I share our story?”, accompanied by the Gospel verse, “Go into all the world and proclaim the good news” (Mark 16:15).

This year, we placed special emphasis on the Foundation in Faith: Catechesis, Evangelization, and Scripture—teaching students about God (knowledge), God's ways (experience), awakening and nourishing faith, and proclaiming the Gospel.

Across school-wide liturgies, Religion classes, homeroom Masses, daily prayer, classroom community time, and service, students explored how we come to know God's Word, deepen our relationship with Him, and share our story—and the Good News—with others.

## LITERARY TRIP TO ENGLAND

During Spring Break, 45 of our Grades 10 to 12 students, along with six faculty members, travelled through England on a literary and cultural experience. The trip included visits to Shakespeare's birthplace in Stratford-upon-Avon, Anne Hathaway's Cottage, the Jane Austen Centre, Westminster Abbey, Canterbury Cathedral, Windsor Castle, Tower of London, and Stonehenge. The group also toured the Harry Potter Studio, visited Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, and attended two productions in London's West End. The trip offered students a deeper connection to literature, both classic and contemporary, and to the people, places, and performances that continue to shape it. The journey was a jam-packed adventure filled with enriching experiences and unforgettable memories!



## JUNIOR EXTENDED SERVICE EXPERIENCE

From June 17 to 20, 2025, SMA hosted its biennial Junior Extended Service Experience (JESE), an optional overnight justice immersion and education program for students in Grades 7 and 8. With daytime placements at local service sites and evenings spent in community and reflection at the school, students explored faith in action. Delivered by the Mission and Charism Team, JESE fosters empathy, deepens understanding of Catholic social teaching, and strengthens community connections. ## 50 YEARS OF INTERNATIONAL DAY

### A CELEBRATION OF CULTURE, COMMUNITY AND FAITH

On April 21, 2025, St. Mary's Academy celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of International Day—an event rooted in appreciation for the many cultures, customs and stories that enrich our school. First held in 1975 as a grassroots gathering organized by the Mothers' Guild (now the Parents' Guild), International Day began in classrooms with home-cooked meals, cultural displays and music. Over time, it has grown into the Parents' Guild signature community building event and one of SMA's most cherished traditions, now filling the Cafeteria, Alumnae Hall and Sheila Chipman Atrium with the sights, sounds and tastes of cultures from around the world.

This year's event featured a multicultural Mass, a "50-Year Walk Down Memory Lane" exhibit, food from 11 cultural pavilions, vibrant entertainment, and raffles.

Our student newspaper, The Spark, published a special anniversary issue with reflections including:

## CONGRATULATIONS CLASS OF 2025!

Our seniors celebrated their milestone year filled with cherished traditions—the Grade 12 Retreat, Graduation Mass and Brunch, Graduation Dinner and Dance, and Convocation. At the Graduate Brunch, Mia Norbury '25 was named Miss Congeniality, as chosen by her peers, and all graduates were inducted into the SMA Alumnae Association. At Convocation, Sophie Sierhuis '25 delivered the Salutatory Address, having been selected by her classmates, Sabrina Batla '25 gave the Valedictorian speech, an honour awarded by a panel of judges. The Address to Graduates was delivered by alumna and former SMA teacher Jeannine Pistawka (Barnabé '88).

Sophie opened Convocation with warmth and gratitude, thanking families, classmates, and teachers for the care, guidance, and encouragement shared throughout their time at SMA. Valedictorian Sabrina Batla '25 offered a moving reflection, sharing two meaningful Urdu words that captured the heart of the day:

“We began this journey with *intezaar*, a constant waiting for this very day. But now, I invite you to let go of that aching anticipation as I teach you another Urdu word, *mukammal*, meaning complete, whole, and fulfilled. We are *mukammal* today, having learned all of the lessons this institution had to offer us, and it is time for us to move forward and embark on new paths filled with new lessons.”

# SISTERS OF THE HOLY NAMES OF JESUS AND MARY



In 1874, the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SNJM) came to the new province of Manitoba from Quebec to assume responsibility for St. Mary's Academy (SMA), which had been founded in 1869 by the Sisters of Charity of Montreal, more commonly known as the Grey Nuns. The SNJM were at the helm of the school until 2022, when they formally withdrew and transferred responsibility for SMA to the St. Mary's Academy Stewardship (SMA Stewardship) on September 12, 2022.

The role of the SMA Stewardship is "to further Catholic education that was originally undertaken by the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg." The SMA Stewardship implements this purpose by exercising canonical Sponsorship over SMA Inc. and SMA Foundation Inc. through the appointment of their members and the reception of annual reports. The members of SMA and the Foundation are accountable to the SMA Stewardship for ensuring the School and the Foundation are implementing their ministry in accordance with the Mission and Governing Philosophy of St. Mary's Academy and the legislation and teachings of the Catholic Church.

Current SMA Stewardship Members are: Archbishop Chatlain, Teresita Chiarella, Reis Pagtakhan, Bob Puchniak, Dr. Mary Shariff '83, Sister Lorraine St-Hilaire, SNJM and Sister Susan Wikeem '63, SNJM.

## UPDATE ON THE SISTERS

Twenty-nine Sisters currently belong to the canonical (administrative unit) Manitoba Province. Fourteen reside at Résidence Despins, an independent and supportive living centre in St. Boniface, while others live in personal care homes or in private accommodations. Many are former SMA faculty and staff and remain connected and involved in the life of the school.

**Sister Josephine Chudzik '59**, a long-serving clerical assistant in the finance office, continues to offer private piano, music theory, and beginner guitar lessons from her studio at the school. She also attends alumnae and retired staff gatherings.

**Sister Michelle Garlinski '88**, former Director of Mission and Charism, lives in Santa Cruz, California, ministering at Villa Maria del Mar, an SNJM-owned retreat centre. Sister Michelle has served there for the past three years.

**Sister Marylyn Gibney** volunteers weekly in the Alumnae Office, helping to maintain contact lists and update records. She is very active with the SNJM Associates and in retired staff gatherings. Sister Marylyn lives at Despins, where she serves as coordinator for the Sisters.

**Sister Mary Gorman '49**, former teacher, principal, and director, resides at Despins. While she now stays closer to home, she continues her ministry of prayer and encouragement for the SMA community. Her many cards and phone calls to staff and community members are appreciated.

**Sister Vera Hoelscher '49**, former teacher and accountant, and **Sister Johanna Jonker '59**, former teacher, also live at Despins. Sister Johanna attends many school events.

**Sister Joanne Pundyk '63**, former teacher, has lived and ministered in Brazil since 1987. She operates the Marie Rose Centre in Maceió.

**Sister Lorraine St-Hilaire**, former teacher and vice-principal, has held governance roles in SMA Inc. and the SMA Foundation. She continues to serve on the SMA Stewardship. For the previous three years, serving with her on the SMA Stewardship were **Sister Edith Grenier** and **Sister Cathy Laviolette**.

**Sister Susan Wikeem '63**, former teacher, principal, and director, is the current SNJM Provincial Superior for Manitoba. She remains involved as a member of the Civil corporations of SMA Inc. and SMA Foundation Inc. and as Convenor of the SMA Stewardship.

As of July 2026, provincial structures and leadership will be replaced by regional groupings with administration centres. A Congregational Leadership Team, headquartered in Longueuil, Quebec, will guide the global community moving forward.

The SNJM Associates are women and men committed to living the mission and spirit of Blessed Marie-Rose Durocher, foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. Today, 516 Associates across Canada, the United States, and beyond carry this legacy forward—56 of them in Manitoba.

Associates are united in giving daily witness to SNJM core values: faith, education, and service for the full development of the human person. According to their individual gifts and circumstances, Associates:

- Promote justice through education and action
- Welcome and advocate for people who are marginalized
- Celebrate and support one another in their faith journey

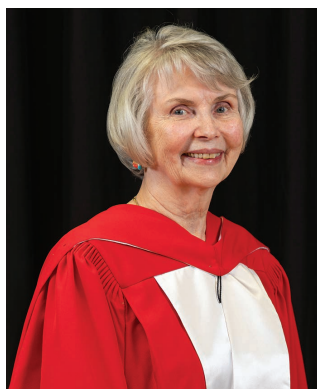

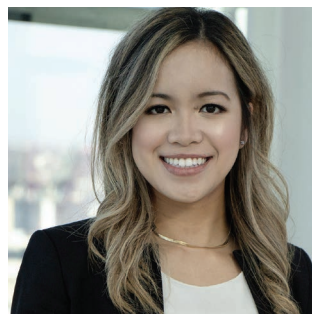

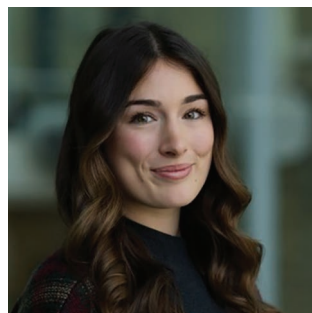
